

Park Trails

- 1. TOMMY'S POND TRAIL .43 miles Medium trail running from Old Homestead, past Tommy's Pond, then up to the main park road. Significant elevation change once you get past Tommy's Pond.
- **2. 650 TRAIL .37 miles** Easy trail running from the main road to the property boundary. Slight elevation change.
- **3. STAGGER RIDGE ROAD TRAIL .6 MILES** Easy ridgetop walk meandering through open meadows. No elevation change.
- 4. STAGGER WOODS TRAIL .22 MILES Medium/easy woodland trail running from the southern end of Stagger Ridge Road Trail (3) to the property boundary. Slight elevation change.
- 5. CEDAR RIDGE TRAIL .41 MILES Medium/easy woodland trail running from the southern end of Stagger Ridge Road Trail (3) to the property boundary. Slight elevation change.
- 6. SCOUT RAVINE TRAIL .25 MILES Medium/difficult woodland trail connecting Stagger Woods Trail (4) and Cedar Ridge Trail (5) creating a loop. Includes wide footbridge over small creek.
- 7. UNDER THE OVERLOOK TRAIL .57 MILES Difficult woodland trail with extreme elevation changes. This trail connects with the main road with Trail #32 creating a loop.
- **8. TWIN-LEAF SPUR TRAIL .17 MILES** Easy woodland walk along a ridge offering splendid views of the Ohio River. No elevation changes.
- **9. FIRST RIDGE ROAD TRAIL .5 MILES** Easy ridgetop walk meandering through an open meadow into the woods. Easy trail.
- **10. SHORT RIDGE TRAIL .3 MILES** Medium/easy woodland trail running from First Ridge Road Trail (9) to property boundary. Moderate elevation changes.
- **11. LARKSPUR TRAIL .2 MILES** Medium/easy woodland trail running from the western end of First Ridge Road Trail (9) to the property boundary. Slight elevation changes.
- **12. WEST RIDGE TRAIL .2 MILES** Medium difficulty woodland trail running from the head of Short Ridge Trail (10) to the property boundary. Includes overlooks of Ohio River. Moderate elevation changes.
- **13. VIC'S SOUTH BRANCH TRAIL .5 MILES** Medium difficulty woodland trail running from First Ridge Road Trail (9) to the property boundary. Includes moderate elevation changes, scenic creek and stone wall.
- **14. STONE WALL TRAIL #1 .3 MILES** Difficult (steep) woodland trail runs from Main Road to Stagger Ridge (3). Severe elevation change.

- **15. STONE WALL TRAIL #2 .35 MILES** Medium difficulty woodland trails runs from Main Park Road to Cedar Ridge Trail (5). Trail is quite narrow in places. Significant elevation changes.
- **16. TIM-UR CONNECTOR TRAIL .25 MILES** Difficult trail connecting Short Ridge Trail (10) and Larkspur Trail (11) creating a loop. Severe elevation changes.
- **17. OVER-LOOK TRAIL .15 MILES** Steep trail from Overlook to 13 Creeks Trail (32).
- **18. MAYAPPLE TRAIL .34 MILES** Moderately steep trail connecting Vic's South Branch Trail (13) with Stagger Ridge Road Trail (3).
- **19. JUNIPER TRAIL .3 MILES** Moderately steep trail connecting Tommy's Pond with the main park road.
- **20. FOUNTAIN HEAD TRAIL .3 MILES** Steep woodland trail connecting the main park road with Trail 18 (Mayapple Trail).
- **21. HICKORY HOLLOW TRAIL .9 MILES** Medium difficulty trail connecting trail #14 with the Main Road.
- **22. GIRL SCOUT TRAIL** .5 **MILES** Medium difficulty trail connecting Main Road with trail #26.
- **23. RED OAK TRAIL .1 MILES** Steep woodland trail connecting trails #4 and #13.
- 24. STEEP CREEK TRAIL .1 MILES Steep woodland trail connecting trails #10 and #13
- **25. BOBCAT TRAIL .2 MILES** Steep woodland trail connecting trails #11 and #12.
- **26. CRITTER CREEK TRAIL .25 MILES** Medium difficulty trail connecting trails #2, #22 and #5.
- **27. BUFFALO TRACE TRAIL .1 MILES** Medium difficulty woodland trail connecting Main Road with Trail #2.
- **28. CATHLEEN'S TRAIL .4 MILES** Medium difficulty woodland trail connecting Trail #9 with 13 Creeks Trail (32).
- **29. RACCOON TAIL TRAIL .1 MILES** Steep woodland trail connecting Trail #13 with Campsite #3.
- **30. STEEP WALL TRAIL .1 MILES** Very steep woodland trail along rock wall connecting trails #13 and #20.
- **31.** HARTIG CREEK TRAIL .4 MILES Easy trail from parking area along Hartig Creek to South Fork Creek.
- **32. 13 CREEKS TRAIL .5 MILES** Moderately difficult trail running from Scenic Overlook to HWY 1992.

- **33. MARKSBERRY TRAIL .2 MILES** Moderately steep woodland trail running from Trail 3 (Stagger Ridge) to Trail 13 (Vic's South Branch).
- **34. RIVERVIEW TRAIL .7 MILES** Moderately easy woodland trail running from parking area on HWY 1992 to eastern most park boundary then back along HWY 1992 to parking area.

GENERAL PARK RULES:

Park closes at dusk

No motorized vehicles allowed on walking trails

Pets must be on leash or otherwise under control

Please clean up after yourself

No hunting without permission of Gallatin

CAMPING GUIDELINES:

Campsite reservations required: (859) 904-9458

Primitive camping only

Camping only in designated sites

Campfires in fire rings only

No cutting of live trees for firewood

Fires must be extinguished and before leaving camp

No discharging of firearms on park property

4 Night camping limit per visit

All applicable Kentucky fishing and boating guidelines must be followed within the confines of Hartig Park



DIRECTIONS TO THE PARK:

From U.S. 42, take KY HWY 1992. Follow HWY 1992 until the pavement ends. Keep going straight onto the gravel lane. The gravel lane leads directly into Hartig Park and Nature Preserve.
